


SUICIDE: INDIANA 2017 FACTS & FIGURES

Suicide Death Rates

	Number of Deaths by Suicide	Rate per 100,000 Population	State Rank
Indiana	960	14.4	28
Nationally	44,193	13.26	



On average, one person dies by suicide **every nine hours** in the state.

Based on most recent 2015 data from CDC



Suicide cost Indiana a total of **\$1,023,791,000** of combined lifetime medical and work loss cost in 2010, or an average of **\$1,184,944** per suicide death.

IN INDIANA, SUICIDE IS THE...

2nd leading cause of death for ages 15-34


3rd leading cause of death for ages 10-14

4th leading cause of death for ages 35-54

10th leading cause of death for ages 55-64

17th leading cause of death for ages 65 & older

More than twice as many people die by suicide in Indiana annually than by homicide; the total deaths to suicide reflect a total of **20,353** years of potential life lost (YPLL) before age 65.

SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

- The State of Indiana Suicide Prevention Task Force is facilitated by the Indiana State Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) Division of Mental Health and Addiction. It is made up of representatives from 10 organizations, including other state agencies such as the Indiana State Department of Health and the Indiana Department of Education, as well as community organizations whose focus is on suicide prevention and the provision of mental health services.
- The State of Indiana Suicide Prevention Task Force developed the updated **Indiana State Suicide Prevention Plan: Journey from Hopelessness to Health**, released September 2012 (<http://www.in.gov/issp/files/plan.pdf>). The Task Force now meets bi-monthly to develop a work plan for implementation of the updated state plan and encourages collaboration with and amongst the state's Regional Suicide Prevention Councils.
- Indiana law (IC §20-28-5-3) requires that, after June 30, 2013, an individual may not receive an initial teaching license unless the individual has received training on suicide prevention and the recognition of signs that a student may be considering suicide.
